He said, "I went skydiving.

And I loved deeper. And I spoke sweeter.
And I gave forgiveness I'd been denying'
"And he said: "Someday I hope you get the chance.
To live like you were dying"

You may recognize the words of the song entitled, "Live like you were dying", as written by Tim McGraw. In the song the singer speaks to a man who had discovered he had cancer and was dying.

The man told him how, now that he knew he was dying, possibly soon, he changed his lifestyle. He began doing things that he had always wanted to do. Things he had never done for various seasons. So, he began to live like he knew he was going to die, possibly sooner rather than later.

The quote above is what he did as a result.

See life differently

Because of his newfound knowledge, he felt his life was more fulfilled. He was motivated to do what he had always wanted to do, and he was much more content than before he came across this diagnosis, because he was now finally doing the things he had always wanted to do.

Now, take note of the verse at the beginning of this article. This teaches us that we are all going to die, someday. There is no arguing the matter. No amount of medication or machines or other technology will keep us from dying. This is a great truth the Scriptures teach us.

We can see this from the beginning of the Scriptures, even in the first few chapters. Adam & Eve chose to sin, and as a result, sin and death entered the world. There is no escaping

death in this life. It has been called a predator that continues to chase us, and no matter what we do, it will find and overtake us in the end.

Prepare for the second life

Why is this important? Because God in His Divine Wisdom wants all of mankind to know what is happening. He wants us to be prepared for what will inevitably find us, Death. "It has been appointed for men to die once, but after this the Judgment."

We can be prepared for that inevitable event.

We prepare ourselves by living our lives as God requires of us. This begins when we first give our lives to Him in faith and obedience. And it continues throughout our lives as we endeavor to live in His Righteousness and Holiness. This is supposed to last a lifetime!

The Lord wants us to live our lives knowing we will die eventually, and that cannot be avoided. But we can be ready for this eventuality, by living by His standards. Such a lifestyle will prepare us for that Day when we stand before the Lord, our Great Judge.

On that Day we will give account of our lives. It teaches in Revelation 20:12:

What will be the end result? Of course, if we remain faithful until death, we will receive a Crown of Life from our Creator and our Judge.

However, we also, I believe, will be more content and fulfilled with our lives. We will have served the purpose of our creation. We would have glorified our God, for this is why we are here on this earth in the first place.

When we have achieved this purpose of our creation, to live to His glory, our lives will be

totally fulfilled and accomplished. There is hope in Jesus' words in John 11:25 Jesus said to her,

"I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live.

One final thing that I like in this song is how the man who knew he was dying "loved deeper, spoke sweeter and gave forgiveness", perhaps because he knew he was going to meet his God.

Having this knowledge within us will encourage us to do the same. May we all live like we are dying!


