"What can wash away my sin?"

Long ago in ancient Egypt, somewhere near the year 1300 B.C., two nations were given short notice that a deadly plague was coming to descend upon them at midnight. This plague was a spirit sent by God, called "the destroyer" and would take the life of every first-born in every house.

Israel and Egypt were about to part ways—this was a great contention against the will of Pharaoh, but according to the will of God—Pharaoh lost.

This was the night of the Passover. Israel was given divine instruction to save themselves and be spared from the coming death that night. The blood of a sacrificed lamb was to be put on the lintel above the door of their home and on the two side posts. Moses explained:

"For the Lord will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the Lord will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite you."

~ Exodus 12:23.

Israel was saved by the blood of a lamb.

Our Passover

In Paul's plea to the brethren at Corinth to keep the Church pure, he said: "Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our Passover, is sacrificed for us."

1 Corinthians 5:7

We can't forget that we too were overshadowed by the darkness of death, until "... the appearing of our Savior Jesus Christ, who hath abolished death, hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel."

~ 2 Timothy 1:10

Walking in accordance to His Word, we live in the divine safety of the blood of the Lamb, not to wander from our spiritual home out into the darkness and danger of 'the destroyer'.

The Red Door

These epic events in Egypt and Israel—particularly the shedding of blood—are not forgotten. Have you ever noticed the many doors painted red on the various denominations in our communities? This ancient tradition goes back to medieval times and even earlier in old Catholic monasteries and cathedrals.

It is a tradition symbolizing that walking through 'the red door', one is passing through the cleansing blood of Christ, entering the holy place purified, into the sanctuary, the church.

(In some European countries, private homes paint their door red when the mortgage is paid off, i.e., declaring their home is debt free—a faint correlation to the blood of Christ paying off the debt of our sins.)

Why did my Savior come to earth?

For you. He came to earth because YOU were in way over your head in sin . . . as we all were. This is the common self-affliction of all men throughout history. I can relate very well to David's lament to God: "For mine iniquities are gone over mine head: as a heavy burden they are too heavy for me."

~ Psalm 38:4

Angels, prophets and apostles have declared this simple singular purpose of why "the Word became flesh" and walked among us. The angel that appeared to Joseph when Jesus was still in the womb of Mary said, "And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name Jesus: for he shall save his people from their sins."

~ Matthew 1:21"

Thirty years later, the purpose of Jesus coming to earth was still the same: The last Old Testament prophet, John the Baptist said this:

The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of

the world."

~ John 1:29

And the Apostle John testifies that "For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he **might destroy** the works of the devil."

~ 1 John 3:8

Christ came to destroy *the only thing* that gives Hell the title to my soul—sin. By his blood, the debt is paid and I am freed from the bondage of sin.

Where is the Blood of Christ?

The popular answer is "at the Cross". And that is true. But how does one get there to reach the "soulcleansing blood of the Lamb"?

The first answer with any clarity was given by the Apostles when men from every nation heard their testimony of Christ, and were convicted of their sins, and asked them, "What shall we do?"

Peter, as his manner was, was the first to answer. As an Apostle he knew exactly where to direct men to reach the blood of Christ for the remission of their sins:

Then Peter said unto them, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."

~ Acts 2:38

In the waters of baptism, the old man of sin is buried, and the new regenerated man is risen from the dead, washed from sin, to live a new life.

Happy day! But we see that before these men went down in the water, they had a change in the heart. The word they heard convicted them of their sins, turned their heart to the One who could save them, and brought a confession from their lips that Jesus Christ is indeed the Son of God.

Pure as the day you were born

The blood of Christ runs deep. Not just in the waters of baptism that we can see, but also in the believing and repentant heart that God sees.

We sin daily, as the Apostle John tells us. And though it is not lawful to be baptized every day to wash away our sins, the Christian has something equally effective—John comforts us saying, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." and be as free from sin as the day we were baptized—every-day!

God has always been this way, in both the Old and New Testaments—merciful, gracious, long-suffering, willing to forgive and remembering our sins no more. As Jeremiah explained: "It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness."

~ Lamentations 3:22-23

So we see that God has made it possible for the Christian to live everyday new and with a fresh start. Forgive and forget the past, put the future in God's hands, and live today rejoicing that He blesses us daily shepherding us to our heavenly home.

If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth. But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.
