This would lead them to easily report what they heard. They answered, "John the Baptist; some say, Elias; and others, One of the prophets."

After listening to their responses, He asks the big question: "But whom say ye that I am?"

It was Peter who appears to answer with little to no hesitation saying with all confidence, "Thou art the Christ. The Son of the living God."

Understanding the Christ

Jesus labored tirelessly to give mankind an understanding of who He is. He taught on the vanity of this short and temporary life and the way to obtain eternal life. He did that by teaching His disciple exactly who He is.

Who are You?

I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. ~ John 10

I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. ~ John 14

I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man eat of this bread, he shall live forever. ~ John 6

I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live. ~ John 11

I am the light of the world. He that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life. ~ John 8

I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. ~ John 10

When Is The First Day Of Spring In 2022?

The first day of spring will occur on **Sunday, March 20, 2022, at 10:33 a.m. CDT** for those of us in the Northern Hemisphere, which is marked by the arrival of the **Vernal (Spring) Equinox**.

Traditionally, we celebrate the first day of spring on March 21, but astronomers and calendar manufacturers alike now say that the spring season starts on March 20th, in all time zones in North America. In 2020, spring fell on March 19th, the earliest first day of spring in 124 years!

Are you a 'Tidsoptimist'?
