## Something special about the $1^{\text {st }}$ Day of the week

There is something very special about the first day of the week to Christians.

I cannot find in the Old Law where the LORD proclaimed the Sabbath Day (or sixth day) to be His day. However, the closest verse to make that point may be Exodus 16:23 23 he said to them, "This is what the LORD has commanded: 'Tomorrow is a day of solemn rest, a holy Sabbath to the LORD; bake what you will bake and boil what you will boil, and all that is left over lay aside to be kept till the morning.'"

With this verse and others in mind, perhaps it could be argued the Sabbath Day was the Old Testament "LORD'S Day." However, it was not the LORD's will the tradition or even the Laws regulating the Sabbath Day be continued into the New Testament era of the church. The Lord had other plans for the church.

There were certainly references to the first day of the week in the OT, but it was the Seventh Day the Lord wanted emphasized as a Day dedicated to Him.

With great purpose, our Lord Jesus, was raised from the dead on the First Day of the week and not on the seventh day, as the verse at a preface to this article states. With a little calculation, we can easily see that what we know as the Day of Pentecost, on which the NT church was first established in Acts 2, was also on the first day of the week, the very same day of the week our Lord was raised on.

We can further see this was the same day of the week that the 1st century church met on to share together and remember the death, burial and resurrection by observing what we commonly called the Lord's Supper every first day of the week as noted in Acts 20:7.

On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread, Paul talked with them, intending to depart on the next day, and he prolonged his speech until midnight.

The apostle Paul writes clearly in 1 Cor 16:12 that since the body was gathered together on that same day, it was the ideal time for the congregations to give into a common collection.

It is further widely accepted that what the apostle John referred to as the "Lord's Day" in Rev 1:10 was probably the first day of the week. What other day of the week could be fittingly called the "Lord's Day", the day our Lord was resurrected? It only makes sense.

We, as the Lord's people, sing a song in Crum's red song book entitled, "Upon The First Day Of The Week" on page 3. It is a beautiful song that highlights what the Lord's people do when they come together every First Day of the week. Each verse starts, "Upon the first day of the week ..." then each verse follows this phrase with something pertaining to that day. Vs 1 states, "Our Savior came forth from
the from the grave." Vs 2 states, "Disciples met to break the bread." Vs 3 says, "Let each of us lay be in store." And vs 4 says, "John saw Christ and heard the trumpet voice," as written in Rev 1 in the verse I mentioned previously as the Lord's Day.

I am absolutely convinced it was with great purpose the Lord wanted His people to gather at least one day every week until the end of this world, when Jesus returns. The Lord created us as creatures of habit with purpose.

As our Creator, He surely knows how to motivate us to His Righteousness and Ways. We can see a shadow of this in the Old Law when Israel was to observe the Sabbath Day the same day every week. We gain much by meeting regularly and consistently.

Over the years, I have spoken to Christians who forsook the assemblies for a time, and came back. Many noted how they felt "empty" and their spirits "unfulfilled" during their absence. It is by meeting regularly every Lord's Day that we "stir up love and good works," as taught in Heb 10:24-25.

Accordingly, there is no substitute that can provide the spiritual sustenance our spirits crave and need, in order to follow the Lord and His Ways.

Let us cherish this great gift, our Lord has provided for the ultimate salvation of our souls. Let us continue to meet "with" the house of the Lord every First Day of the week when possible..

## When Is The First Day Of Spring In 2023?

Monday, March 20, 2023, at 5:24 p.m. EDT.
Traditionally, we celebrate the first day of spring on March 21, but astronomers and calendar manufacturers alike now say that the spring season starts on March 20th, in all time zones in North America. In 2020, spring fell on March 19th, the earliest first day of spring in 124 years!

Regardless of what the weather is doing outside, spring equinox marks the official start of the spring season.

The current seasonal lengths for the Northern Hemisphere are (approximately):

* Summer - 93.641 days
\# Autumn - 89.834 days
* Winter - 88.994 days
* Spring - 92.771 days

As you can see, the warm seasons, spring and summer, combined are 7.584 days longer than the colder seasons, fall and winter (good news for warm weather lovers!).
