"Righteousness always shines in a dark world"

Despite all the different countries and cultures in the world, each with their own mix of religions, politics, and philosophies— too many to count; there are actually only two civilizations in the world, two races of people, whose world views are quite different from each other.

They are *the righteous* and *the wicked*—those that serve God, and those that serve Him not. All of humanity is a 'citizen' of one or the other. (*Malachi 3:18*)

The epic confrontation between Cain and Abel appears to be when mankind went his two separate ways. Abel serving God according to God's will (bringing a blood sacrifice) and Cain serving God according to his own carnal will (offering "the fruit of the ground"). (Genesis 4)

Obviously a blood sacrifice was what God commanded and Cain's offering violated that command. God never said to offer what Cain decided to offer. (Not unlike musical instruments in worship today.)

God counseled Cain for his good; but to no avail. For after Cain spoke with Abel, he rose up and killed him. "And wherefore slew he him? Because his own works were evil, and his brother's righteous." (1 John 3:12)

Mankind now walked on two paths in complete opposition to each other.

Sons of God and the Children of Men

As we enter the days of Noah, these two peoples, the sons of God and the children of men, appear to be well established as separate societies. Philippians 2:13-15 / John 3:17-19 But it was not long before the righteous began to yield and to mix. For when "the sons of God saw that the daughters of men were beautiful, they took wives for themselves of all whom they had chosen." (Genesis 6)

This did not bring good results.

After the sons of God saw the daughters of men, it was only four verses later that God issues His judgement to destroy man from off the face of the earth!

The children from these unions did not result in a righteous people, but quite the opposite. They became the mighty and famous men of the world, very wicked, whose *"every imagination of the thoughts in their heart was only evil* continually."

These are also referred to as *giants* in some translations, and as the *Nephilims* in others, meaning *the fallen*, as in *fallen away from God*. They are also referenced as *the violent ones*, which makes sense as we read, "*Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight, and the earth was filled with violence.*"

So how did the fallen, violent, and wicked men now dominate the earth? *What happened to the sons of God?* Where did the righteous go? They failed to instill their righteousness in the next generation and vanished off the face of the earth!

Noah—"the [last] light of the world"

With things as dark as they could be, there was one man who remained a faithful son of God. That one man was Noah. "Noah was a just and upright man in his time: and Noah walked with God." (Genesis 6:9)

He was quite a man! Imagine living in that fallen race and still teaching the gospel of his time. He was *"a preacher of righteousness"* in a violent, bloody, and rebellious world. (1 Peter 2:5)

And as a result, immediately after God said He will destroy man off the face of the earth, we read, "But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord." (Genesis 6:8)

Noah was the Apostle Peter of his day, showing mankind the ONE WAY to salvation. *"Hear, believe, repent, confess, and get in the boat!"*

Unfortunately, 3000 did not obey Noah's call to repentance, but only his three sons— their wives, and mom.

To what purpose did God show us this?

So that New Testament sons of God can diligently follow this Old Testament father and mentor heeding "the warnings of God" of things we haven't seen as yet, e.g., the end of the world, passing through death, and standing before the Judgement Seat.

"For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope." (Romans 15:4)

Are we a light in this dark world? Are we 'preachers of righteousness' refusing to be silent? (Jeremiah 20:9) If not, we best get started. For "our time is short." And I believe it is starting to rain.
