I thought she was loony.

But now that they're going their own ways, I understand better. She meant, "Store up all these experiences in your heart because some day in their absence, you'll enjoy all those treasures, without any of the fatigue and frustration."

So as I face this quieter Mother's Day, I'm going to take time for *pondering*, appreciating the memory of all those great surprise breakfasts

in bed (without enduring any burned toast crumbs under my pillow). What a gift!
