We delivered jars of dewy lilacs to the resting places of those we had known for all too short a time: Mick. the sheep shearer; Roy, the chicken rancher: and Loraine and Emmett. godparents of my son Tom.

When we had finished, I walked back toward the van reminiscing, while Trina and her friend lagged behind carrying the leftover lilacs.

"Wow, this one says "BORN OCTOBER 31, 1903, DIED MARCH 29, 1904." Trina squinted, calculating, "She was only a baby! Look, Mom." I retraced my steps to the bleached stone, topped with a lamb.

"And nobody even

brought her any flowers," said Rachel disconsolately.

"Well, let's give her some!" said Trina.

"Are there any more babies?" Rachel wondered. Both girls scanned the flowerless plaques, some bearing sentiments like "Budded on earth to bloom in heaven" or "God needs angels too." The girls continued to put flowers on the babies' graves until the lilacs were gone.

I shouldn't have worried about carrying on the tradition far from home. Our Memorial Day recollection is in compassionate hands.
