"When will our pool be finished?" my mother asked.

"It is finished," I said glumly.

As I think back on that experience, I realize that my personal ambitions have often been like that pool. I start out with fantastic ideas of what my life will be like. Then after I've been digging for a short time, I start moving in my stake.

Our dreams for life will tarnish if we're too unrealistic. We need to let the Lord direct us before we start hammering in our stakes.
