The biggest issue today for Christians is . . .

I was listening to an interview recently of a well-known evangelical preacher. He was asked the question— “What is the single biggest issue for Christians today?”

The clergyman looked very thoughtful as he looked into the camera and answered: “I believe there are really two issues that are the single biggest concerns for Christians today. They are Abortion and Gay Marriage.” My thought was that this man was considered a leader among the evangelical churches, and his opinion would certainly be heeded by his followers.

I could not disagree with him more.

Of course, the evangelical churches can do and say and think whatever they want. I am part of the Lord's body that does not take instruction and advice from such men. As Christians, we heed the writings of the apostles and prophets in the Scriptures as our faith and practice.

To be sure, Satan would love for us to heed this man's advice. Satan would desire we take our eyes off the Lord and what He desires of us and focus on such distractions.

I understand that the issues the preacher raises are concerning and troubling. But are they truly the most important issues for the Lord's people to be focused on? I contend strongly that they are not the biggest issues for Christians today. As a matter of fact, I contend that when our focus is on such earthly concerns, we will be distracted from what the Lord desires we focus upon.

Now, to be clear, we have a right to speak against such evils. We can vote as citizens of this great country in addition to using other rights we have as

Americans to speak out against evil. But are these and other social evils to be our biggest concerns?

The question at the beginning of this article can be answered in many different ways, but all the ways presented in the Word must focus on the most important concerns for Christians.

For instance, there are the two greatest commandments as taught by Jesus in Mark 12:30-31. We are told to love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength. We are told to love our neighbors as ourselves. Am I doing this the way God requires? As individual Christians, are we loving God first and our neighbors second? This should be a most important issue for me.

Jesus could have mentioned a number of evils that existed in both Roman and Jewish society at that time. There was infanticide, which included the practice of leaving babies who were unwanted, to die in the elements. Jesus could have told us to start political petitions to demand that prayers begin at every Roman Senate meeting. He could have demanded the Romans depart from the Jewish land. He could have urged His followers to do any number of political priorities.

But what did He teach? He taught us to love and pray for our enemies. He taught His followers to serve one another. He taught us to not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will take care of itself. He taught us to seek first the kingdom of God. In my estimation these are among the biggest issues for Christians.

If I were to give an answer to the question: “What is the single biggest issue for Christians today?” I would say, consider the apostle Paul's admonition in 2 Corinthians 13:5-6 5 “Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you

not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you? — unless indeed you are disqualified. But I trust that you will know that we are not disqualified.”

Now THAT may be the single biggest issue for Christians in this 21st century!

Satan would prefer we concentrate on other issues rather the ones that concern our souls. He is the master of distractions! He certainly had a role in Israel, as they awaited Moses to come down from the Mountain. They should have been preparing themselves by prayer and meditation as they were getting ready to receive the Words of the Lord. Instead they were concentrating on other things, and we know what those things were.

As they sent the twelve spies into Canaan, rather than thinking on and being thankful for the Land the Lord was giving them, ten of the spies were concentrating on the giants who were there rather than the blessings from the Lord. And the majority of Israel agreed with them! So much that they wanted to put Joshua and Caleb to death! Once again Satan distracted the Lord’s people.

Time and again the Lord’s people allowed themselves to become distracted and concentrate on things that were not as important. Men and women such as David, Solomon, Jonah, Peter, Ananias and Sapphira, etc. Churches such as Corinth, Ephesus, Sardis, Laodicea concentrated on the wrong things. In all of these cases if they did not repent and turn their attention to godly priorities, they would have lost their souls.

Let us, as the Lord’s people, not be distracted. Yes, there is much evil in this wicked and adulterous

generation. But if we spend our time concentrating on society’s evils, it can be disheartening and discouraging. Worst of all, we will be distracted from what truly counts toward our salvation.

So let us rather keep our focus on the Lord and His will for our individual lives. Let us examine our own lives so that we will not be disqualified in that Great Day.

Hebrews 12:1-3 1 *“Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.”*
