While I was laid up for 5 weeks before and after my surgery I discovered one of the most comfortable positions to lay on was on my left side. It seemed to alleviate my pain quite a bit. I would try to lay in this position about 2 hours or so every afternoon. While I was lying there, I would often watch a review of an NFL game. During the summer months a tv station would replay some of the best games in addition to some classic Super Bowl games.


