The Attitude of Gratitude

"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." ~ 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

One thing that makes this passage of Scripture powerful is the Apostle's attitude and admonition in spite of the many hardships he faced in the midst of his work. (2 Cor 6:4-5; 11:22-29)

He considered it worthy of mentioning to the brothers and sisters -- "In everything give thanks." I am unsure if he wrote it because brethren were in the habit of complaining, but I suspect it may have been motivated by being aware of the normal uncomfortable aspects we all have to face from time to time. Perhaps he had words on his mind that he had previously uttered in Acts 14:22, "We must through many tribulations enter the kingdom of God." Whatever the motivation, these words are very powerful and will help us through the difficulties we all must face from time to time.

As we look at our world today, there are many places in the midst of societal upheavals. South America is having a number of rebellions. Europe is having its share of turmoil. There are problems in the Far East. Of course, the Middle East is always having serious problems. And, yes, our own country is having a severe political and moral divide on many issues. Unfortunately, I do not foresee a calming in the near future, and I suspect it will continue to worsen, especially in light of my following observations.

With all of these problems happening in our world, how can the Lord's people keep their spirits pure and their lives at peace? By applying the principles Paul wrote in the above passage. And truly one of the principles that can help us tremendously is the attitude of *"Gratitude"*! And yes, in every circumstance! To be sure, I do not think this is teaching us that we are glad or happy when facing severe trials. But it is telling us to be thankful in all things. We can be thankful the Lord is helping us deal with these types of things. We can be thankful for our growth that may be a result of dealing with difficulties and the lessons we can learn from serious difficulties.

I heard an interesting discussion this morning on the importance of "*Gratitude*". One of the highlights was that we can always see things in our lives and be grateful for them if we are willing to look for them. The most contented people in our world are those that are thankful for what they have! And all we have to do is look around with spiritual and grateful eyes.

Consider this—How many of us awoke this morning with the knowledge we had food available to us? How many of us slept last night in a dwelling that kept the cold or heat or rain or wind off of us? How many of us had at least one closet filled with apparel of all sorts including shoes and jackets and other forms of clothing? How many of us of working age had jobs we were relatively assured were waiting for us? Jobs that would continue to purchase the above necessary items in the near future? How many of us felt relatively confident that when we returned home from working or shopping or other errands our dwellings would be unmolested? I am very confident the vast majority of those reading this article could say "Yes!" to probably all of the above questions if they were honest with themselves. Yes, I know there is a very small percentage in this land who cannot say yes to all of the above questions, but can you?

And of course, there are the special and perpetual spiritual blessings in heavenly places that we, as the Lord's Christians, are promised by our God. How many of us have faithful brothers and sisters to meet with every week as the Lord's congregation? And we have numerous Bibles at hand as we continue to seek our Lord's will in a better and more sure way. There are countless blessings showered upon us as rain from Heaven if we would only open our eyes!

The same writer who gave us the above passage also wrote in Philippians 2:14-16 "Do all things without complaining and disputing, that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain."

From my perspective "complaining and disputing" is a sign of a lack of gratitude for what we have. "Complaining" was probably the single most destructive factor that led to almost the entire number of adults of that first generation of Israelites that were brought out with Jehovah's mighty hand to march and die in the Wilderness. And this was in spite of the great blessings the Lord provided bringing His people out of bondage and providing them what they needed in the wilderness.

In my estimation, it is a lack of gratitude that is at the heart of many of our problems in these United States. It is at the heart of many whose lives and spirits are in turmoil today. Let us, as the Lord's people, not be among this number. Let us continually give thanks and appreciation for what our God has bestowed upon our lives both physical and even more importantly, spiritual. Let us *"in everything give thanks"*.


