The Good Shepherd

John 10:1-16

This time of year, many will hear the wonderful story of Joseph and Mary in Bethlehem, when Mary gave birth to her first-born Son.

On that night there were shepherds abiding in the field keeping watch over their flock. And to their great surprise an angel appeared unto them with “good tidings of great joy”.

Those shepherds took that angelic message they heard that night and were the first to proclaim that “a Savior, Christ the Lord, was born”.

It was an epic account of a shepherd’s voice second only to that of the babe in the manger they saw that night. That babe became the Great Shepherd also known as “the Good Shepherd.” And His voice would be heard around the world ‘til the end of time.

I recently listened to a talk given in 2014 by an elder who actually was a shepherd and led his flocks over a period of 50 years.

With that experience and knowledge he took the Word of God to give a lesson titled “*The Good Shepherd*”. And shared the many parallels he witnessed between his sheep and the souls of men.

On his farm they had about 150 ewes and after they lambed they had about 300 sheep on the farm in the early days. Not unexpectedly he was often asked, “How are we like sheep, as spoken of in Scripture?”

Let me share some of those observations he gave in the lesson. This lesson was given by Duane Proudfit, elder at the Martensdale congregation, and can be heard at the website referenced at the end of this article.

Elders serve The Good Shepherd

After some introductory thoughts, the talk opens with three scriptures as the premise:

- Christ is the Chief Shepherd. He is the head and none other. (1 Peter 5:1-4)
- He is the Great Shepherd of the Sheep. He has all authority given by God. (Heb 13:20)
- And He plainly testifies that “I am the Good Shepherd”. (John 10:11 & 14).

Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He is the one and He is the only! Those who serve under Him, serve by *His* will; and at *His* word and by *His* word. The Church is *His* flock, it is *His* fold, and *He* is the Door. (John 10:7)

Sheep know their shepherd

“If anyone tells you they know all there is to know about sheep, don’t believe them. Sheep are one of the most interesting animals and yet one of the most difficult to understand.”

The scriptures mention ‘a fold’, but today we know it as a ‘sheep pen’. Shepherds would bring their sheep to the sheep pen which pre-

vented predators from preying on the sheep in the night. In the morning, the shepherd would come and call his sheep. And only those sheep that know that shepherd's voice would come to the gate.

Duane's sheep knew his voice. Even if they did not see him, just hearing his voice, they would come. If the sheep came and saw someone was with Duane, the sheep would not immediately come. Because they did not know the stranger.

Human beings are all followers

The sheep bond with the voice of the shepherd. We are followers, but we like sheep, can choose who we follow. We can choose the Good Shepherd.

Joshua said to the Israelites, *"If it seem evil unto you to serve the Lord, **choose** you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were on the other side of the flood, or the gods of the Amorites, in*

whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

Joshua did not give an option to follow no one. We all follow someone. Duane said, "I never saw a sheep unsure of who he was following . . . unless he was lost."

Psalms 23 proclaims, "The Lord is my Shepherd. I shall never want." Are we sure who we are following? Will we hear the Shepherds voice? Will we recognize His voice?

There is only one Good Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Savior.

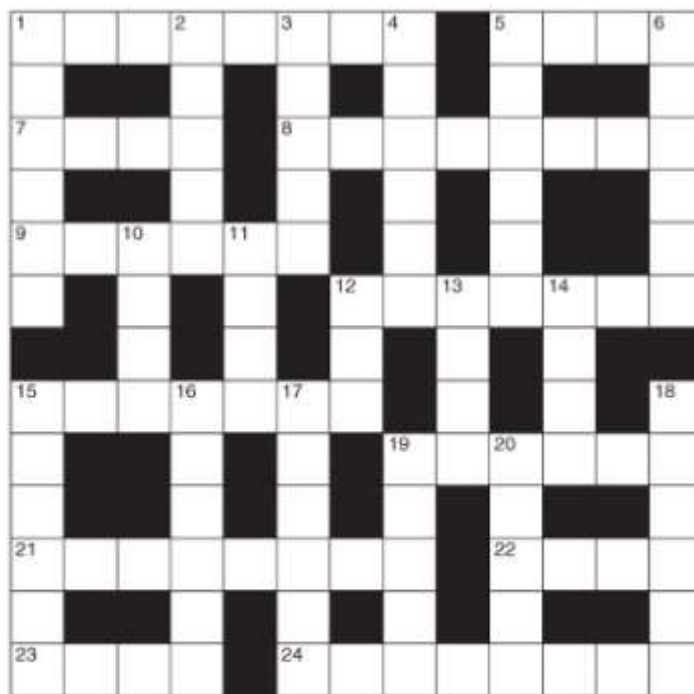
