The Ephesians were taught by Jesus!

Probably around 50 AD the apostle Paul visited the city of Ephesus. This would be just under 2 decades following the death and subsequent resurrection of Jesus.

As recorded in Acts 19, Paul established the congregation of the Lord's Christians as a result of his visit to that city. I feel very confident there were few if any Christians who became part of that body of believers who had ever met Jesus. They had heard John's message, probably from Apollos, but certainly, there were none who had been taught by the Man Jesus while He lived on this earth.

Ephesus was many hundreds of miles to the north of Judea, where Jesus lived, performed His mission and died as a result. Jesus probably never traveled to that area—of this I am confident.

Why do I mention this? Because, it is interesting, for according to Paul's writing in the above verses, he wrote that the brothers and sisters there had been "taught by Him"! How was this possible? How could those Christians at Ephesus have been taught by Jesus? What an interesting question! How indeed?

Throughout Paul's letter to these Christians, he mentioned a number of things they had heard and been taught concerning this

same Jesus and His message of salvation.

In 1:13 Paul wrote how they had "heard the word of truth, the gospel of" their salvation. As a result, they believed that gospel, and they were "sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise". Paul wrote in 1:15 of how he had heard of their faith in Jesus. Paul wrote in 2:17 of how "He (Jesus) came and preached peace" to them, even though Jesus had never been in their city. In Acts 20:17-38, following several years in the area, Paul reminded them of how he had worked among them in good conscience in all humility and had kept back nothing from them that was needed and helpful to their salvation.

At the close of the chapter, he said his goodbye and departed the area. Yet, when Paul wrote them the letter, several years later, he wrote of how they had been taught by Jesus, Himself. Hmm... This is a mystery? Not really.

The Scriptures teach when anyone hears or reads the Lord's Word they are being taught by Jesus. We are admonished in Colossians 3:16 "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord."

What is the "word of Christ"? It is the Lord's teachings. What part we might ask? All of it! It is God's word! Jesus taught in John 14:6 "Jesus said to him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

Speaking of the Lord's Word in general as noted in Psalms 119:142 "Your righteousness is an everlasting righteousness, and Your law is truth."

What part? All of it! Consider Psalms 119:160 "The entirety of Your word is truth, and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever."

This is one of the reasons Jesus' teachings were so much different than the teachings of the Jewish leaders. His teachings were higher than mans'. This was why Jesus could speak with authority! He was teaching His Own Word! His Own commandments! His Own Truth! Because He is the originator and source of Truth!

When those at Ephesus heard the gospel from the apostle, they were in essence hearing it from Jesus. Anytime we hear and receive the gospel we hear it and receive it from Jesus, Himself. It does not originate from any other source. Now, to be clear, false doctrines originate from another source. False gospels originate from another source. But Truth comes through the Lord only.

This same principle certainly applies to our modern times. When we hear Truth as it has been originated and established from the Lord, we are hearing it from December 2021

Jesus. This is why we also should "Let the Word of Christ dwell" in us richly. This is why when we hear the "Word of truth" and believe it, we are sealed with that same Holy Spirit of promise as the Ephesians were, as all the Lord's people are.

May Jesus and His Truth continue to be preached by His

faithful until He returns. May we, as the Lord's people, only seek after His Truth, for it is only through Jesus can salvation be found and will be realized at the end of our earthy time.
