


April 2009

After a long time the hungry bird hopped to the edge of the nest, then out onto a leaf. Finally, it set its wings in motion, lifted to a higher branch and after a moment's rest, zipped out of sight.

In that moment it was as if God said, It's time to leave your comfort zone. Don't worry. Your future is in My hands.


