So that's what we did. We settled down. We studied the animals. We admired the scenery. We talked about the wonders of God's creations. Finally, after a b o ut fifteen minutes "Belligerent" (as we had named her) rose up and moved over to the side of the road. Other bison followed, leaving enough room for us to drive past.

Today, back in the concrete city, whenever I get impatient about temporary roadblocks in my job or in my private life, I remember those bison. It's God's way of telling me, "Stop fussing and fuming. Be patient. Take time to look around and admire the wonders of My world."
