# Evangelist Jay Graham Report 2025

Dear brothers and sisters,

The Lord has blessed us once again to live into another year. May we work to glorify His name throughout. The Lord is good. He continues to bless and grant us His Grace and Peace. As we begin this new year here in America's Great Southwest, I thought it was time for me to write you and keep you abreast of our efforts in His Kingdom. I am continuing to work, primarily with six congregations here in the Southwest.

The Lord continues to bless the Williams congregation. As usual, our numbers have dwindled in the midst of winter. We average probably 10 to fifteen on Lord's Days.

Brothers Peter Espitia and Larry Brice take the bulk of the teaching responsibilities, and I try to help when I am here, which is usually one Lord's Day and one or two Wednesdays per month. When I am teaching the class, I have been going through the three letters of John, and we are almost finished.

Ryan and Lydia's children are a bright spot for the congregation, as young children often are. Yes, they are a bit noisy, as children naturally are. But I am sure, for those of you who have been in congregations without children, having children is generally a great blessing. Highlighting this point—This past Lord's Day Jayce (5 years) was showing everyone how he lost his first tooth. The brothers and sisters were amused! We do have one resident teenage sister, Shea.

The brothers and sisters of the Huachuca City, AZ congregation continue to worship the Lord in spirit and truth. Our brother Dennis Richter continues to take the bulk of the responsibilities, though he does have the help of Matthew, a brother who attends regularly from the Tucson area.

They have also been blessed to have an older couple who have been attending recently. This is a brother who has been an elder of another congregation, and due to their age, they feel they needed to make their drive shorter. I believe they will be a great blessing to the congregation.

I try to be with them one Lord's Day and one Wednesday each month. When I am there, I have been teaching on various topics including the books of Hebrews, Luke and the Revelation letter at their request. They continue to show much faith as they work to show the Light of the Lord to their neighbors and friends.

They are also blessed with Cody Gentry, of the Pima congregation, bringing lessons at Huachuca City on a regular basis.

The Pima, AZ congregation continues to worship the Lord regularly. As has been the case for many years now, they meet in Dave and Janet Gentry's home. The Gentrys show much hospitality to the brothers and sisters as they provide meals regularly as well as a comfortable place to meet. I try to be with them one Lord's Day and one Thursday evening each month. I am continuing to teach on the history found in the Old Testament as well as the three letters of John.

Though the church at Pima is also few in number, they are blessed with 4 brothers who teach! They also are working diligently to show the Light of the Lord to their friends and neighbors.

I am continuing to meet with the church at Chama, NM. They also are few in number, especially during the winter months, but they have much faith!

The Tafoya family make up most of the brethren. They have a woman who visits regularly and is a friend of

Toni's. Thus far she seems very receptive to the seed being planted in her heart.

She has been reading and studying the Scriptures recently and was present last Lord's Day when I was there. She seemed very attentive and interested in my lesson from Acts chapter 2. I announced when I hoped to be with them next, and after the meeting she told me she was looking forward to my return. I try to be with them one Lord's Day and one Thursday each month.

The brothers and sisters at White Rock, NM continue to worship the Lord in spirit and truth. The congregation has lost a number of teachers over the past several years who moved away.

They have several faithful brothers to carry on the teaching and leading responsibilities still. I try to be with them one Lord's Day and one Wednesday every three months or so. 


#### Heartfelt Love & Prayers:

Unlike some months of the year named after Roman gods or emperors, February is different. Instead, it is named after the Roman



**festival of purification called "Februa**," which occurred on the 15<sup>th</sup> of that month, meaning the name essentially translates to "the month of cleansing." It is often mistakenly assumed that February was named after the Roman god Februas.

from Latin 'februarius mensis', meaning "month of purification"

### How to Tell Whether Your Coffee Is Fresh

Coffee beans do have an expiration date and can go bad like any other perishable ingredient.

#### Tips to tell whether your beans are fresh.

#### TIP 1: Check the roasted date

- Sometimes coffee roasters put "roasted on" dates on their labels. You can check your coffee bag for the date and calculate how long it has been since the beans have been roasted. Some roasters even thoughtfully put a "best by" date next to the roasted date to help consumers figure out when to use their fresh beans.
- If your bag doesn't have this information, try this method for estimating the roasted date. Seal beans in a zipper-lock bag and leave overnight (be sure to press out all of the air). If the beans were roasted 7-10 days ago, they'll release carbon dioxide, puffing up the bag. If the bag stays flat, the beans are no longer fresh.
- Though coffee beans are safe to use for several months after being roasted, their flavor will start to deteriorate after two to three weeks. Kaleena Teoh, co-founder of Coffee Project New York, recommends sourcing your coffee from a local roaster to ensure freshness.:

### TIP 2: Check the appearance

Freshly roasted coffee beans have a healthy, glossy shine but are not overly greasy. Dark roast beans may appear shinier than light roasts. However, old beans develop an oily sheen due to exposure to oxygen. Some beans may even dry out and become crackly, which is a telltale sign that it's about time to throw them out.

#### TIP 3: Take a sniff

Aroma is another key indicator of the freshness of your coffee beans. Fresh beans have a robust, roasty, and fragrant smell whereas old beans smell rancid and stale.

### TIP 4: See if your coffee "Blooms"

If you make your coffee using a pour-over coffee maker, you can visually monitor how fresh your coffee is. When brewing fresh coffee, you will see the coffee bed blooming when you add hot water into it. "Blooming" refers to the first step of pour-over coffee making, during which a small amount of hot water wets the ground coffee, which immediately activates the carbon dioxide in the coffee that makes it look foamy and "bloomy."

**Definition:** Deuterocanonical (apocryphal) books. The deuterocanonical books, meaning 'of, pertaining to, or constituting a second canon', collectively known as the Deuterocanon.

These are certain books and passages considered to be canonical books of the Old Testament by the Catholic Church, the Eastern Orthodox Church, the Oriental Orthodox Church, and the Church of the East. In contrast, modern Rabbinic Judaism and Protestants regard the DC as *Apocrypha*.

**Note:** St. Jerome (c. 347–420), the foremost Scripture scholar of his day, didn't accept the deuterocanonical books as Scripture. He was the primary author of the Latin Vulgate Bible, which he translated between 383 and 404. The Vulgate is a Latin translation of the Bible that was used in Western Europe from the Middle Ages to the 20th century.
